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Clothes and Accessories

backpack noun [C]

a large bag used to carry things on your back, used especially by people who go camping or walking:

• It's a frame backpack with a belt and padded shoulder straps.

bag

noun [C]

a soft container made out of paper or thin plastic, and open at the top, used to hold foods and other goods:

• Don't eat that whole bag of sweets at once.

belt

noun [C]

a strip of leather or material worn around the waist to support clothes or for decoration:

• She fastened her belt tightly around her waist.

blouse

noun [C]

a shirt for a woman or girl:

• my mum bought me a white silk blouse last weekend.

boot

noun [C]

a type of shoe that covers the whole foot and the lower part of the leg:

• She loves her brand-new walking boots made of leather.

bracelet

noun [C]

A piece of jewellery that is worn around the wrist or arm:

• Her elder sister likes wearing a diamond bracelet.













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button

noun [C]

A small, usually circular object used to fasten something, for example a shirt or coat:

• *I did up/undid (= fastened/unfastened) the buttons on* my blouse

cap

noun [C]

A soft flat hat that has a curved part sticking out at the front, often worn as part of a uniform:

• The police usually wear black caps as they patrol in the street.

chain

noun [C]

rings usually made of metal that are connected together and used as jewellery:

Mary was wearing a beautiful silver chain around her neck.

clothes

noun [plural]

things such as dresses and trousers that you wear to cover, protect, or decorate your body:

• She usually wears casual clothes.

coat

noun [C]

an outer piece of clothing with sleeves that is worn over other clothes, usually for warmth:

• Do you coat up, Joe, or you'll freeze.

collar

noun [C]

the part around the neck of a piece of clothing, usually sewn on and sometimes made of different material:

Your shirt collar is too dirty now.













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cotton

noun [U]

thread or cloth made from the fibres of the cotton plant:She looked pretty in a simple cotton dress.

dress

noun [C]

a piece of clothing for women or girls that covers the top half of the body and hangs down over the legs:

• She wore a gorgeous wedding dress yesterday.

earring

noun [C]

a piece of jewellery, usually one of a pair, worn in a pair, worn in a hole in the ear or fastened to the ear by a clip:

• He was wearing an earring in his left ear.

fashion

noun [C or U]

a style that is popular at a particular time, especially in clothes, hair, make-up, etc.:

- Fur coats have gone out of fashion.
- She always wears the latest fashions.

fasten

verb [I or T]

to become firmly fixed together, in position, or closed:

- Make sure your seat belt is securely fastened.
- This shirt fastens at the back.

fit

verb [I or T]

to be the right size or shape for someone or something:

- That jacket fits you perfectly.
- I don't think another desk will fit into this classroom.

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
